Example:

Freshman Year

Track (varsity 400 meter)

Helped at Middle School track meet, April 2019, 4 hours, handed out water

Sophomore Year

Cross Country (Junior varsity)

Track (varsity 400 meter)

Homecoming - October 2019, 2 hours, made posters

Team Tualatin, July 2020, 40 hours, painted park equipment, weeded, planted trees

Junior Year

Packleader - 30 hours, attended training, led incoming freshman

Regatta Run - October 2021, 3 hours, helped set up balloon arch

Tualatin Putting Down Roots - November 2021, 3 hours, planted trees

Tip: Be a leader

- Become an officer in a club
- Lead a community service project
- Lead a one time event in a club
- Class project

- Family responsibilities can count as activities
- Opportunity to explain on college essay

Letters of Recommendation

*Identify 2-3 adults who know you well

- Teacher
- Coach
- Boss
- Club Advisor
- NOT family or friend



*Brag Sheet - on College and Career Website

*Tips:

- Give adequate time for recommender to write letter
- Give them specifics academics, specific qualities, challenges or activity involvement
- May not be needed for college applications
- Be sure to thank recommender

Rising to the Top of the Pile

- Be competitive with other applicants
- Demonstrate uniqueness
- Show that you have multiple skills and interests by covering a variety of areas in your life
- Perfect your essay(s)

How important are IB Classes?

- Colleges use Holistic Approach
 Colleges get School Profile showing course offerings
- Colleges will consider rigor of coursework taken when reviewing admission application
- Consider your potential performance in class
 Can take individual IB classes vs Full IB
- **Diploma**
- IB Testing may not be necessary

- Get involved in sports and clubs and activities at TuHS
- Record your community service hours
- Do the best you can in your classes and establish a strong GPA

- Perfect your reading comprehension, time management, and study skills
- Start thinking about what you like to do that could turn into a career
- Get involved in TuHS clubs and teams
- Record your community service hours
- Continue to focus on a strong GPA or work to improve your GPA

Juniors and Seniors

THINGS TO DO JUNIOR YEAR

- Set goals and identify a career path
- Stay involved in clubs and teams and start taking leadership roles
- Volunteer in the community and record the dates, hours and service activities
- Continue to focus on a strong GPA
- Take the ACT. You only need to take the ACT or SAT.
- Plan to visit colleges over Spring Break and the summer – look for College Open Houses
- Attend the Spring National College Fair held each year in Portland.
- Look for the essay prompts on college websites late spring to start on your essays

THINGS TO DO SENIOR YEAR

- Verify you are on track to graduate
- Stay involved in TuHS clubs and teams
- Volunteer in the community
- Consider a part time job
- Review your SAT and ACT scores. Retake the test, if necessary.
- Sign up for Tualatin High College Visits thru Naviance to meet with representatives from colleges you might be interested in attending.
- Apply to colleges with at least one safety school in mind
- Apply for financial aid and scholarships
- Consider college options and select a college which is the best fit for you based on field of study available, location, cost, and activities
