College Process Tips

- Identify career path/degree choice
- · Identify college criteria
- Identify possible colleges (Supermatch)
- Be realistic in your search (Scattergrams)
- Have a back up plan
- Give yourself time to complete the applications



Types of applications

 Common App - application for over 600 colleges in US

 Coalition App - used by 10 states in Washington, Texas, and New Mexico

Direct to Institution - find on school's website

Common App Info

- Create account at www.commonapp.org
- Add colleges
- Add recommenders and counselors
- Provide general/common information
- Provide individual and any supplemental essays
- FERPA
- Entering grades from transcript



Should I use Common App?

Please DON'T unless

 You are applying to a college that only allows application through the Common App



- You are applying to 3 or more colleges
- You plan ahead to give your counselor time to process the multiple items we are required to complete

Getting Transcripts

- Common App TuHS Counselor will get notified and provide
- Direct to Institution Request through Naviance
- For College Coursework Need to order separately from Colleges

FERPA

- Family Education Rights and Privacy Act
- Allows parents/students 45 days to review a request for a transcript before it is sent
- Allows Tualatin High to share transcript with colleges
- Will need to sign FERPA agreement waiving right to review request on Common App and/or Naviance



Applying to Colleges in Other States

- Use Naviance to research school possibilities
- Look at Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) for schools with reduced tuition
- Explore colleges through website, Tualatin College Visits
- In person College Visits Some colleges provide paid college visits

Applying to Prestigious Schools

- Research the school
- Position yourself for a great application
- Make yourself unique
- Reality check Scattergrams
- Connect with college staff Email, Phone & TuHS Visits
- Perfect your application

PSU, Western Oregon	2.6 GPA, HS grad with Algebra 2, 2 years of foreign language
OSU	3.1 GPA, HS Grad with Algebra 2, 2 years of foreign language
UO	3.3 GPA, HS Grad with Algebra 2, 2 years of foreign language
Harvard, Purdue, Stanford	Minimum 3.7 GPA, Intro to Calculus, Foreign Language, Activities, Great Essay, Diversity

Appealing Admission Decision

- Investigate why you didn't get accepted -College Admission Representative
- Remedy situation if possible ex. online or summer classes
- Provide written explanation
- Provide letters of recommendation

THINGS TO DO FRESHMAN YEAR

- Choose classes that interest and challenge you
- Get involved in sports and clubs and activities at TuHS
- Record your community service hours
- Do the best you can in your classes and establish a strong GPA

THINGS TO DO SOPHOMORE YEAR

- Perfect your reading comprehension, time management, and study skills
- Start thinking about what you like to do that could turn into a career
- Get involved in TuHS clubs and teams
- Record your community service hours
- Continue to focus on a strong GPA or work to improve your GPA

Juniors and Seniors

THINGS TO DO JUNIOR YEAR

- Set goals and identify a career path
- Stay involved in clubs and teams and start taking leadership roles
- Volunteer in the community and record the dates, hours and service activities
- Continue to focus on a strong GPA
- Take the ACT. You only need to take the ACT or SAT.
- Plan to visit colleges over Spring Break and the summer – look for College Open Houses
- Attend the Spring National College Fair held each year in Portland.
- Look for the essay prompts on college websites late spring to start on your essays

THINGS TO DO SENIOR YEAR

- Verify you are on track to graduate
- Stay involved in TuHS clubs and teams
- Volunteer in the community
- Consider a part time job
- Review your SAT and ACT scores. Retake the test, if necessary.
- Sign up for Tualatin High College Visits thru Naviance to meet with representatives from colleges you might be interested in attending.
- Apply to colleges with at least one safety school in mind
- Apply for financial aid and scholarships
- Consider college options and select a college which is the best fit for you based on field of study available, location, cost, and activities
