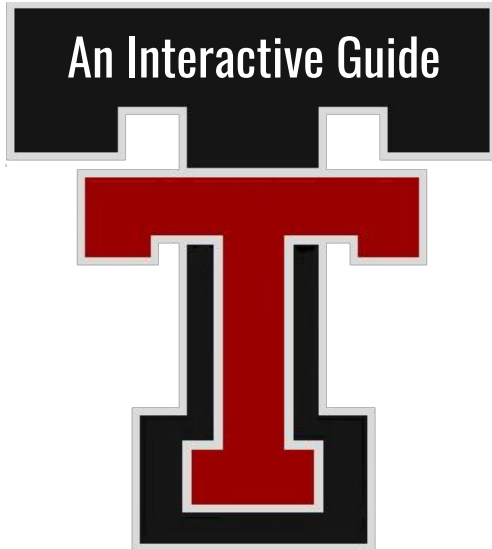

THE COMMON APPLICATION

The Common Application is an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to any of more than 800 member colleges and universities in 49 states and the District of Columbia, as well as in Canada, China, and many European countries.

REQUESTING LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

STEP 1: Start College Applications before requesting letters of rec

Do not request a letter of rec unless you know it's required by an institution for admission. Many schools do not require them

Do not request more letters of rec than required

Talk to a teacher/counselor in person to see if they are able to write you a letter of recommendation

STEP 2: Fill out Letter of Rec "Brag Form" via Naviance

Teachers and Counselors will refer to your brag sheet when writing your letter (give good details)

Provide information to help us highlight your strengths and accomplishments

Access the Brag Form in Naviance under the "About Me" Home Page

STEP 3: Officially Request Recommender

Follow up with an email. Send official requests to counselors and teachers after:

- 1) They've agreed in person
- 2) You've completed the brag sheet

If you are using the Common Application, you will "Add Recommenders" in the Colleges Section of your Common App Account.

COMPLETING THE FAFSA (FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID)

Financial aid from the federal government to help you pay for education expenses at an eligible college or career school. Grants, loans and work-study are types of federal student aid. You must complete the FAFSA form to apply for this aid.

STEP 1: [Create your FSA ID](#)

Create your FSA ID now

Students, parents, and borrowers are required to use an FSA ID, made up of a username and password, to access certain U.S. Department of Education websites. Your FSA ID is used to confirm your identity when accessing your financial aid information and electronically signing your federal student aid documents.

STEP 2: [Fill out FAFSA](#)

The FAFSA is open Oct 1, 2021

Filling out the FAFSA[®] form can be a straightforward and easy process. The FAFSA site will guide you through the application; select the “Start here” button on the home page, and just follow the directions on the screen.

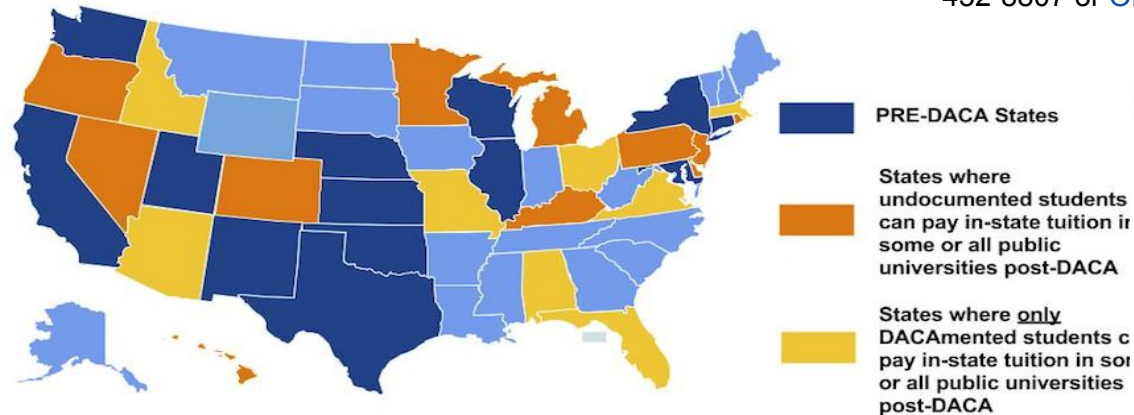

THE ORSAA (OREGON STUDENT APPLICATION FOR AID)

The ORSAA is an alternative to the FAFSA for undocumented Oregon students, including students who have Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status or Temporary Protected Status (TPS). Eligible undocumented and DACA students in Oregon can get help to pay for college. Learn more about

Oregon Promise

ELIGIBILITY

- Be a recent Oregon high school graduate or GED® test graduate.
- Attend an Oregon community college *by your [required start term](#)*, based on your graduation date.
- Have a 2.50 cumulative high school GPA or higher, or a 145 grade on all GED® tests.
- Be an Oregon resident for at least 12 months prior to college attendance. For dependent students, your parent(s) must also live in Oregon.
- Have no more than [90 college credits](#) completed or attempted.
- Students may be subject to eligibility requirements based on their **Expected Family Contribution (EFC)**. EFC eligibility requirements are subject to change based on available funding.



HOW DO I APPLY?

1. Create an account in the [OSAC Student Portal](#)
2. Complete Oregon Promise Application in OSAC Student Portal by the Deadline
3. Provide proof of your GPA. (Tualatin will submit for you!)
4. Complete the [FAFSA or ORSAA](#) for the academic year when you will start college. List at least one Oregon community college.

OSAC SCHOLARSHIP CATALOG

Scholarships- like grants- are financial aid that you do not need to pay back. There is no cost to apply.

OSAC awards more than \$18 million in scholarships annually. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 or more. You don't need to be a merit scholar or a student with financial need to apply. OSAC administers more than 600 scholarship programs, and you may qualify, but you won't know unless you apply!
